

From the very first day of Respite Care Ministry in January of 2016 I knew this was going to change my life forever! I had hoped we were going to change the story of dementia in our community from fear and dread to hope and life! AND we did it! Volunteers came from all over our community to unite in one purpose and that was to give our caregivers rest and our participants love and purpose. Five years, two expansions, and a pandemic later, I am pleased to report that the state of Respite Care Ministry is stronger than ever.

April 20<sup>th</sup>, 2021 was GRAND RE-OPENING DAY! After being closed since March of 2020 due to COVID-19, it was the most glorious reunion! Our Respite Care community returned excited and ready to serve. We returned with a new appreciation of our time together, a larger sense of purpose and it felt like all of our hearts for this ministry had doubled in size! The first day was filled with almost all new families and new faces. We started with four participants two days a week and were quickly up to 12 participants each day in no time. Covid reared it's ugly head again and created a second "pause" for Respite Care Ministry. October we returned four days a week and began rebuilding again. Our caregivers need us. Our participants need us. We all need each other. We have built a community of love at Respite Care Ministry that won't give up!!

I hope you enjoy this look back over the last year. THANK YOU to all of you that made our reopening possible! Your time, financial gifts, prayers and encouragement kept this ministry on solid ground during a VERY difficult year. Thank you for blessing our families living with dementia and for helping us love them just as they are...uniquely made and beautiful children of God. They remember love because of YOU!

# RE-OPENING DAY!


